Pandemic Preparedness Toolkit Project

The Pandemic Preparedness Toolkit is a five-year project (2023 – 2028), funded by Wellcome. This project aims to co-create an accessible and sustainable online Toolkit to enable National Statistical Offices (NSOs) to add value to infectious disease surveillance systems by unlocking their expertise in this area.

The UK Office for National Statistics (ONS) is collaborating with NSOs and Delivery Partners within Argentina, Malawi and Nepal to co-develop the Toolkit. The initiatives within each country are referred to as 'Pathfinder Projects', which is being delivered in Nepal by HERD International.

Strengthened infectious disease surveillance systems globally, through a shared Toolkit for quality statistics and leadership.

Develop a sustainable online Toolkit that will build capacity for infectious disease surveillance in NSOs.

Strengthen engagement between project partner **NSOs and National Public** Health Agencies.

Achieve awareness of the Toolkit across Low-and Middle-Income Country NSOs globally.

Secondary users



Those who collaborate, or could collaborate, with the NSOs to conduct infectious disease surveillance.




Global NSOs
